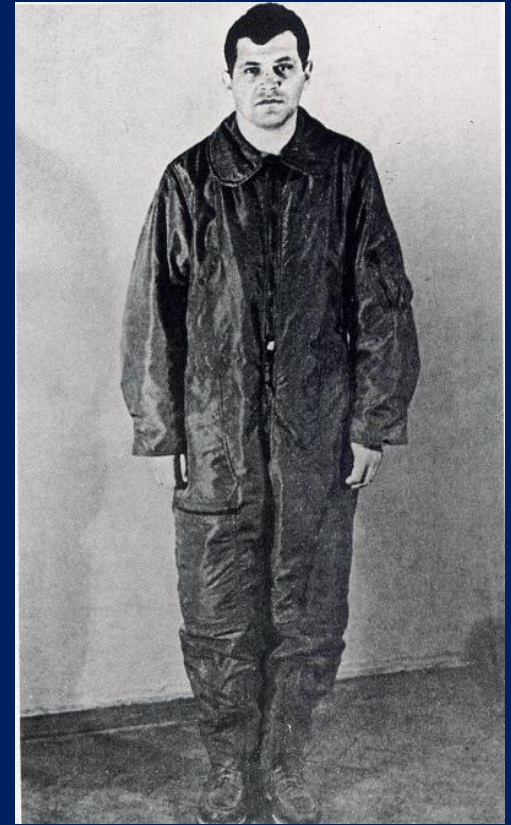
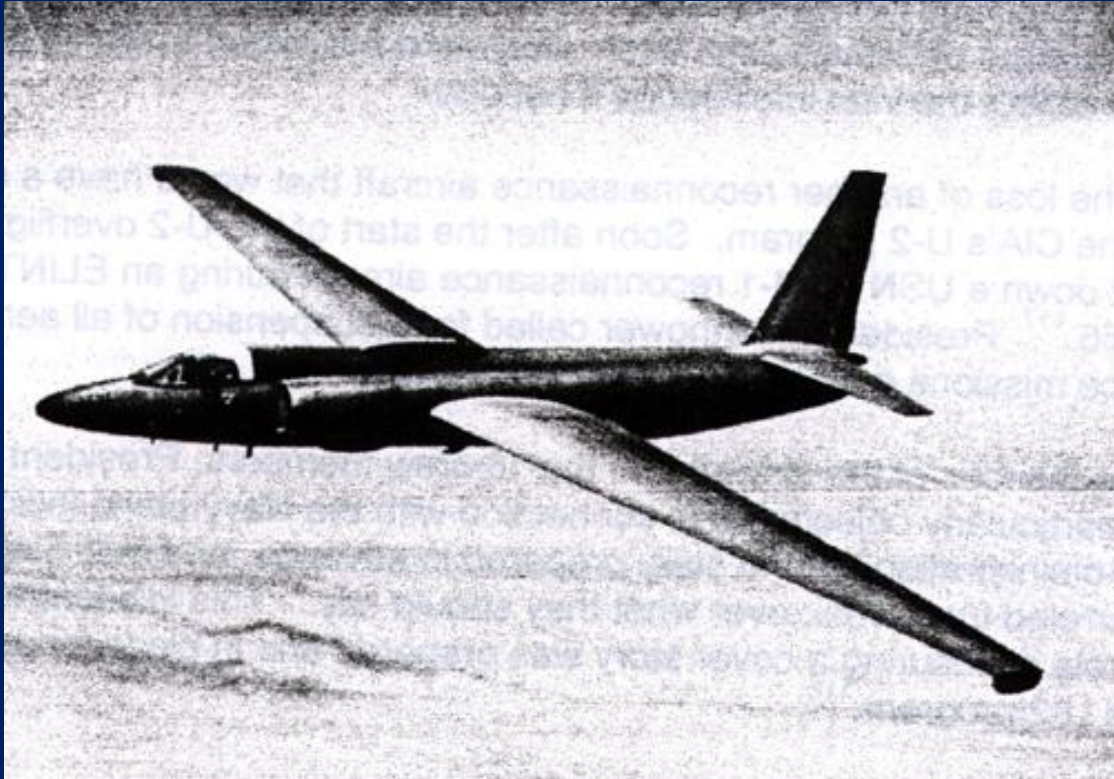

Russia Swaps Powers for Red Spy

One year, nine months, and ten days after his ill-fated U-2 flight, Powers was dramatically exchanged for Soviet spy Colonel Rudolph Abel, in the first Cold War spy exchange.

Following his release from a Russian prison, Powers was held incommunicado for another twenty-four days by the CIA in "safe" houses in Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. Powers' own story of the U-2 incident was suppressed for eight years, until the publication of this book.
